Encourage Families to Enroll and Participate in the Community Foundation's Early Award Scholarship Program



<u>Step 1: Enroll</u> in a CollegeChoice 529 Direct Account at <u>www.CollegeChoiceDirect.com</u>. (This is the family-owned 529 savings account into which family and/or friends can deposit money if they are able.)



<u>Step 2: Agree to Participate</u> in the Early Award Scholarship Program at <u>www.cfwabash.org/Early-Award-Scholarships</u>. (Completing the Participation Agreement opens a Community Foundation-owned Scholarship Fund into which the Community Foundation deposits scholarships and savings matches.)

Talk to Your Students about Their Future and about Early Award Scholarships

Remind students they have money in their Scholarship Funds

- Each time your complete your assignments, you are one step closer to earning scholarships this quarter.
- From 4th-8th grade, you can earn up to \$1,000 for future job training.
- To earn early award scholarships, just finish all your assignments on time.
- You have money in your scholarship fund because you have worked hard, and because your community wants to help you build a bright future.
- Look at your Progress Report and Fund Statement to see the scholarships you are earning.
- How much money have you saved for career training or college by doing your schoolwork? I can tell you what your current balance is. Or, look at your latest Fund Statement.

Encourage Enrollment

- Early Award Scholarships are for <u>all</u> students. You don't have to have extra money or be super smart.
- More than 60% of students in Wabash County schools are earning early award scholarships. You can do it too! Don't leave money on the table.

Encourage Savings

- It's never too early or too late to save for your future job training.
- If you can find \$20 to put in your 529 account, you will get a \$20 savings match, every semester!

Orient Students toward the Future

- You are saving for college just by doing your assignments. You are a college saver!
- What kind of work will you do after high school? What kind of training will you need to get your dream job?
- It's okay if you don't know what career to choose right now. Early Award Scholarships are available until you turn 26, so you have time to figure it out.
- Early Award Scholarships pay for all kinds of training at different schools: welding school, heavy equipment operator license, cosmetology certification, associate's degree, college degree, etc.
- School is getting harder, but you know by now that important things are often hard.
